Please be prepared in the event of a weather emergency. Make sure that you have sump pumps, generators, flashlights, etc. Please also make sure that your driveways are clear of overhanging trees that may inhibit access to your residence by emergency vehicles.

Reminder of Open Burn Laws:

Just FYI... If we are called for an open burn, we may put it out!

Under Ohio law, these materials may not be burned anywhere in the state at any time: garbage, any wastes created in the process of handling, preparing, cooking or consuming food; materials containing rubber, grease and asphalt or made from petroleum, such as tires, cars and auto parts... (including furniture), plastics or plastic- coated wire; and dead animals

Other restrictions: Open burning is not allowed when air pollution warnings, alerts or emergencies are in effect. Fires cannot obscure visibility for roadways, railroad tracks or airfields No wastes generated off the premises may be burned. For example, a tree trimming contractor may not haul branches and limbs to another site to burn.

Seven Mile Fire Department and Life Squad

Hello Milford Township residents, I am Kathy Allen, Captain of the Seven Mile Fire Department and Life Squad. As many of you may know, our department provides life squad service to a portion of Milford Township. We cover the east side of the township, along with Collinsville and Somerville, and the other half is covered by Oxford Life Squad.

Our department, along with the Milford Township Fire Chiefs and the Milford Township Trustees, met in December of 2018 to discuss the business for the upcoming year and any concerns that may exist. Some residents were concerned about the response time for our life squad to arrive at their home after calling 911. I will address that issue by saying, Seven Mile is the same as Milford Township in the fact that we are all still volunteer. We do not have the means or the manpower to staff a station 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. When you call 911, the Butler County dispatchers take your call, then route it to the fire dispatcher who then activates our tones for the call. All members have pagers and cell phone activation, and we have a system to show who is responding to the station for the call. A life squad must have a minimum of two certified personnel in order to respond to the call. Therefore, we respond as quickly as possible from our homes and the local area, to the station, to make a crew.

Once a crew is assembled, we begin our response to your call. All responses are made using red lights and sirens, until we arrive at your call. We can experience a slowdown because travel time to some scenes can take up to 10 minutes. That response time can also be complicated by bad weather and road conditions, trains blocking major roadways, or an influx of drivers who do not pay attention to what is behind them. Therefore, our times are different for each and every call. Once we arrive on scene, then we begin the treatment and

transport if necessary, based on your situation.

Thank you for allowing me the time to help to understand the workings of our life squad. We take pride in serving the residents of our areas and hope that your experience with our crews have been up to your expectations. Our brothers and sisters of Milford Township Fire invite us to train with them and we do the same at our department. We continue to train weekly, and look forward to serving you for many years to come.

Butler County Auditor Roger Reynolds explains that the revaluation process begins with our appraisers reviewing aerial images of every parcel, adding new construction and then conducting drive-by site visits beginning in the fall of 2019.

Sales from 2017, 2018 and 2019 are reviewed along with home and property condition and a value is established for the 2020 tax year (payable in 2021).
