Fire Report Milford Township Fire Association

Our annual Spaghetti Dinner is Saturday, April 18, 2020 from 4-7 at the Milford Twp. Community Center in Collinsville, OH. Dine in or carry out. Our annual raffle is for a ¼ beef from Koch Farms. Recently the Fire Department was able to purchase a trailer that we are in the process of equipping with specialty rescue equipment! This equipment includes the grain bin rescue and other important equipment that we don't use on our average calls.

We continue to train within our department and with neighboring departments. We work under mutual aid agreements, which means that each department agrees to respond to another department's call to assist when needed.

Please be prepared in the event of a weather emergency. Make sure that you have sump pumps, generators, flashlights, etc. Please also make sure that your driveways are clear of overhanging trees that may inhibit access to your residence by emergency vehicles.

Thank you to SW Ohio Family Farm Safety and Russ Beckner for donating to the 911 Reflective Address Sign Initiative. In the event of an emergency, every second counts and 911 address signs help our first responders quickly locate emergency situations. Support of this important safety program is greatly appreciated.

We continue to collect aluminum cans. There are barrels located outside of our stations in Collinsville, Darrtown and Somerville. We use this money to purchase educational material used at Bogan Elementary as well as numerous other events. If you have a large pick up, you may call 513-726-4311 and leave a message. Somerville and Milford Township

In March 2016, the Village of Somerville voted 25 to 24 to dissolve it's incorporated status. The Mayor and Council met for the last time in December of 2015 and voted to place the issue before the voters. For many years, the Village had operated

on a small budget of about \$50,000, which was enough for a part time employee to help mow grass, clean streets, and plow and salt, among other duties. However, residents felt that with this low budget and a lack of interest among many in the Village to volunteer to serve on Council, that dissolving and returning to Milford Township would lead to better outcomes.

The dissolution process was long, and the Village officially returned to Milford Township in the summer of 2017. In that time, Milford Township has taken an active role in investing in the Village, and this year there will be even more noticeable improvements!

Here is a brief list:

- In 2020, every public road and alley will be paved.
- In 2018 and 2019, every sign on a Township road (not just Somerville, but the whole Township!) was replaced.
- In 2017, paved Mill St, from Bulldog Dr. to the County Line.
- Somerville Fire Station (now Station 163):
 - 1. Lighting was upgraded
 - 2. Interior painted
 - 3. Repaired front apron (driveway)
 - 4. New grass truck purchased
 - 5. Upgraded Engine by relocating from Collinsville
- 6. New storm warning siren purchased

Butler County Auditor, David Brown, Deputy Auditor

After nearly two years advocating for fuel quality testing legislation, Butler County Auditor Roger Reynolds is pleased with the Feb. 10 introduction of House Bill 499 by primary sponsors Reps. George Lang (R-West Chester) and Brigid Kelly (D-Cincinnati).

This bi-partisan legislation was also co-sponsored by Rep. Sara Curuthers (R-Hamilton) among others.

If this passes as introduced, County Auditors would be granted the permissive authority to test fuel for water, sediment and octane level. Currently, Ohio is one of only three states that does not have a

fuel quality testing program in place. Alaska and Nebraska are the others.

Program helps older adults stay independent at home

The Butler County Elderly Services Program (ESP) makes staying at home possible for older adults who need help caring for themselves. Seniors age 65 and older may qualify for services that can make all the difference in quality of life.

Services include housekeeping, home-delivered meals, transportation, personal care, adult day service, care management, emergency response and more. These

services are provided at a fraction of the cost of nursing home

In 2019, ESP served approximately 4,000 older adults. But the program is for more than just seniors. Butler County ESP makes a big difference for families who are caring for older loved ones.

Butler County ESP is funded by the county's Senior Services tax levy. It is administered by Council on Aging of Southwestern Ohio, with support from a community advisory council. Intake and care management are provided by LifeSpan.
