

This November election, the Fire Department tax levy is up for renewal. This is a five year 2 mill levy that is ongoing. The levy will not raise your taxes since it is a renewal of the current 2 mill levy. Again, thank all of you for your continued support of the fire department.

As fall approaches remember to check your chimneys for clogs. Have them checked to prevent chimney fires. Also check batteries in your smoke detectors and CO detectors.

We are continuing to collect aluminum cans at each of the stations. This money goes to purchases needed; such as, supplies and equipment. Assistant Chief Jim Meador has done a great job taking care of collecting and taking the cans to recycle.

The Butler County Auditor’s Office spent the last two years appraising approximately 160,000 properties as part of our state-mandated 2020 property reappraisal. This project is a massive undertaking and one that we strive to perform with great accuracy. Upon completion of our appraisal, values are submitted to the State Tax Commissioner for final approval. Property owners are also informed that their new, 2020 property value is available for review.

Homeowners and those with agricultural property will be receiving notification in the mail soon.

The good news, for all of us, is the housing market has remained strong despite the COVID-19 pandemic. However, some areas of commercial real estate have suffered and that will be reflected in our appraisals.

Milford Township Updates

Road Paving: Milford Township has made major improvements to road surfaces this year! Soon, hopefully by the mailing of this letter, all public roads and alleys will be paved in Somerville, a small section of Hamilton Eaton leading in to Somerville, and Bauer Road.

Lighting Upgrades: Have you noticed the new street lighting in Somerville, Darrtown, and at Green Brier Lake? New lights that will provide better visibility and save the Township money!

COVID-19 Measures: The Township will be making improvements to the Community Center and Fire Departments that include major upgrades to bathroom and kitchen plumbing fixtures as well as installing hand sanitizing stations throughout. We will also be spending more time and using new equipment to clean and sanitize after each use.

New Playground Equipment: We are expecting that during the month of September, there will be new playground equipment in Somerville! Milford Township is working together with the Tyler Richardson Foundation to install new equipment and mulch. The Coalition for a Healthy Community has also contributed to the project.

Butler Rural Electric Cooperative and Cincinnati Bell partner to bring high-speed internet to cooperative members

Butler Rural Electric Cooperative and Cincinnati Bell have partnered to begin delivering high-speed Fioptics internet to parts of the cooperative's service territory. The partnership allows Cincinnati Bell to provide fiber-based services to the cooperative's substations and other equipment to enhance reliability.

Homes will receive fiber based on the route for fiber to reach the cooperative's substations. After the project is complete, fiber will be closer to homes in Milford Township than ever before. Our hope is that this will help reduce the cost of fiber expansion in the future. Butler Rural Electric Cooperative will continue to look for ways to make fiber available to all members.

Cincinnati Bell has begun work to make Fioptics internet available to more than 2,000 Butler Rural Electric Cooperative members over the next year. 506 homes in Milford Township will receive fiber internet as part of the agreement. Cincinnati Bell will notify members as addresses become eligible for internet.

To find out if your home or business will have access to Fioptics internet as part of the partnership, visit cincinnatiBell.com/special-pages/brec to submit your address and contact information. A Cincinnati Bell representative will get back to you shortly after submitting the form. If your address is not part of the current agreement, Cincinnati Bell will add it to a database of interested members.
