What Happened to the Fence at Collinsville Cemetery? Russell McMillian

A section of the iron fence at Collinsville Cemetery fell last summer on one of the township employees. Fortunately, is did not hurt him, but due to the heaviness of the section, the Township could have had a large Workman's Comp lawsuit. Even worse, the fence could have really injured a resident visiting the cemetery, a small child, or an elderly person.

This fence is well over 100 years old and the method of tightening the fence is an adjustable piece of metal at the bottom of the fence, next to the ground. These metal pieces are rusted beyond use. We have put in some steel posts and iron rods over the years, to help tighten the fencing. While this works for a while, when the ground is very wet and winds are strong, the fence loosens, again posing a safety risk. There is just too much liability for the Township to leave the fence in place, in its current condition.

We have gotten two different estimates to have it repaired. One estimate was over \$7,000 and the other was over \$11,000. Unfortunately, due to the economy and the available funds in the cemetery account, there is no money for this big of an expense. The fence is safe in storage, and we will continue to pursue options to have it repaired.

The Coke-otto Boys will provide live music and a short round of "Darrtown Trivia" will be offered each hour.


Tables for playing cards will be available.

Spring HAS to be around the corner! This winter has brought a bag of mixed tricks to Milford Township, but this area has been fortunate compared to other sections of the U.S. The Milford Township road crew has been called out several times so far this winter, but we haven't had to use an extreme amount of rock salt and sand.

The new section of walking track behind the Community Center has been completed and is getting much use from township residents. The original gravel section of walking track will get reconditioned this spring. Hopefully it will be blacktopped soon.

A little more than half of the new playground equipment has been installed at the Community Center. We will complete this project

when Mother Nature provides some sunshine and drier weather.

Black topping is planned for North Street and Darrtown Road, from SR 177 to the Hanover Twp line. This usually happens late summer to early fall. As weather improves the maintenance crew will be out making road repairs throughout the Twp.

The Milford Township Maintenance Dept has been replacing most of the traffic warning signs in Milford Twp, with new high visibility signs. "Stop" and "Stop Ahead" signs have been our priority. If you see any signs that you feel we may have missed, please call the maintenance department at 513-523-2842.

Finally, Paul Gillespie applied for, and won, an \$80,000 grant to pave the roads on the west side of Darrtown! This grant was won through the Butler County Community Development Block Grant program. Hopefully, the paving will occur in 2013.

Collinsville Post Office

According to the USPS, the Collinsville Post Office does not receive enough volume nor make enough in sales to keep it open 8 hours a day during the week. Therefore, residents have to consider other options. Most discussed options are to keep the post office open for 2 hours a day during the week for stamp sales, etc, but PO boxes would have to be placed outside (USPS allows at least eight hours to pick up mail), or closing the post office and placing the PO boxes at another location.

The new location could be on Twp property at the Community Center or old Firehouse on Depot Rd. At the writing of this newsletter, nothing has been finalized.

No matter the outcome, did you know that **Dunkelberger Lawn and Garden** now sells stamps and flat rate boxes? They also ship flat rate boxes, have a drop box, and mail is picked up when their mail arrives from Hamilton. Hours are convenient, and you can even use these services when the post office is closed!
