As this newsletter is coming out, the state of Ohio is nearing completion on the improvements to the intersection of SR 127 and 73. ODOT is also finishing repairs to the bridge on SR 127, south of Hamilton Eaton Rd. Soon, 1700 feet of paved walking track at the community center will be ready to be used. The paving of Harris Rd. between SR 177 and Oxford Milford Rd. will also soon

be completed. The Milford Township Maintenance Department replaced two culvert tiles in that section of Harris Rd.

The dry summer required us to reseed most of the new graves in our three cemeteries and in October we will be pouring foundations for headstones. I would like to ask everyone to take a moment to review the cemetery rules posted at the cemetery gates and on the Milford Township website. These rules help the maintenance department safely maintain the cemeteries and keep them more attractive for everyone. Thank you for your attention to this.

Lastly, I would like to remind everyone to be careful out there on the roads. Keep a watchful eye as hunting season has started and deer are on the move. Community Center Spotlight-Robyn Huston's Dance Studio

Do you have a child interested in dance? Have you always wanted to learn to dance yourself? Now is the time! Robyn's Dance Studio offers lessons in clogging, lyrical, tap, jazz and hip-hop for ages three to adult. Running October through May, with a recital in June, Robyn's classes focus on learning proper technique while having maximum fun.

Robyn's Dance Studio was founded in 1998 by Robyn Huston and operates at the Collinsville Community Center. A lifelong resident of Milford Township, Robyn was inspired to start her business to share her love of dance with her three daughters, as well as with the local community. In just 14 years, Robyn's Dance Studio has grown from a handful of students to nearly 100, and regularly competes in regional competitions in Mason, Dayton and Indianapolis. The Studio will be working to make it to the national competition in Sandusky, Ohio in July 2013.

To offset some of the fees for competitions, costumes, and lessons our dancers hold various fundraisers throughout the year. In February we hold our annual Valentine's Dances, which includes one for kids ages 10 to 15 and one for adults only. We also sold honey, candles, and jewelry, held a car wash and worked at Walt's Barbeque Community Night event.

Robyn's dancers also enjoy performing at local festivals and events. This past year they danced at the Somerville Homecoming, the Senior Citizens Center in Oxford, Liberty Matrix Nursing Home, and Relay for Life.

DARRTOWN BICENTENNIAL PLANS PROGRESSING

The Darrtown Bicentennial Steering Committee continues to work toward organizing a memorable celebration of Darrtown's 200th year on July 5-6, 2014.

A landscaping project in the town square has already begun. Milford Township Trustees arranged for the recent removal of several dead or dying trees and local landscapers are joining forces to refurbish the area with trees, shrubs, and plants. Plans include the construction of a memorial to honor military veterans from Darrtown and vicinity.

The 4-H program is alive and well in Milford Township thanks to lots of community support from township employees and trustees. The Collinsville Community Center is our hub and proudly displays the 4-H banner. I am part of the Milford Mini Farmers, established in 1978. We are a livestock club and include an awesome group of youth and families. We not only learn about livestock projects, but participate in community service activities by partnering with Woodland Country Manor and the Milford Township Fire Association's annual spaghetti dinner. Other 4-H clubs also specialize in areas such as small animals. There are over 150 projects available, everything from rockets, woodworking, scrapbooking, cooking, sewing, large and small animals, dogs, cats, cake decorating, money management and more.

The county 4-H offers programs throughout the year in addition to what each club offers. One example is the Teen Leadership in Action Workshop. Event will be November 3, 2012 in Lebanon, OH. Youth participants gain leadership skills in communication, professionalism, self-confidence, and diversity. Eligibility for 4-H membership begins at age 5 and enrolled in kindergarten, known as Cloverbuds. They can participate in all activities but cannot compete in Junior Fair. However, they can enter into Open Class. Entries to compete in Junior Fair begin when a child is at least age 8 and enrolled in 3rd grade as of January 1 of current year. Trustee's Desk

By the time you read this newsletter, Harris Rd, between SR177 and Oxford-Milford, should be paved. The Township is currently considering options for Fall 2013 resurfacing. As the cost of paving becomes prohibitive, we are considering alternatives to paving that are cost effective, durable, and will keep our roadways safe.

Did you know that we are currently in negotiations with the City of Oxford to renew the Township's EMS contract? Oxford covers the Western half of the Township, while the Village of Seven Mile covers the Eastern half. Both contracts come out of the Fire Department's budget. Each year we renew the contract with both communities. Your Trustees and Fire Department negotiate to ensure that residents are provided the best possible EMS service at the best possible cost.

Fiscal Officer

It has been a very busy first six months as your fiscal officer! The fiscal year will soon be coming to a close, the Uniform Accounting Network (UAN) software system will have a major upgrade and our bi-annual audit will be here shortly!

I am looking forward to the new software, and training will be coming up at the end of October. I am hopeful that the upgrades will make using the system a little easier.

BMV License Tax

When you annually register your vehicle, there is a license plate tax fee from the state, a portion of which comes back to the township, as long as it is properly designated.

Ensure that your tax dollars are returning to Milford Township, by taking a moment to verify with the BMV (Bureau of Motor Vehicles) that Milford Township is listed on your vehicle registration prior to renewal or new registration. If you renew your license plates by mail or via a third party, such as a leasing company, verify that Milford Township is designated as the recipient of the tax dollars.

If Milford Township is not specifically designated as the area where you live, the money will not go to our community. If you have any questions about the license fee, please call the Ohio BMV at 614-752-7500. Help keep Milford Tax dollars in Milford Township to benefit our community!
